- We provide quality programs that meet the language and orientation needs of students.

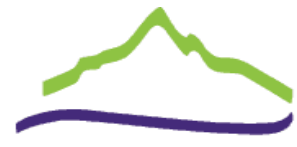
OUR GOALS

THE ELSA PROGRAM

What will you learn?

In the ELSA Program you will learn English to help you in many ways, for example:

- talk to friends and neighbours, teachers and doctors
- talk to people in stores and other community places
- learn about Canada, the Canadian school system, and laws
- look for a job and an apartment
- learn about English grammar and pronunciation
- use English in many other everyday situations

How will you learn?

Our school is small and friendly.

- You will learn English by speaking with your classmates and practising your new language with them, often in groups or with partners.
- You may get homework sometimes. Reviewing what you learn in class each day will help you improve your English.
- Your class will go on field trips outside school to learn about different places in the community (for example to a pharmacy, Community Centre, supermarket).
- Guest speakers (for example a policeman, a health care worker) will come into the class to tell you about services in the community. These are important parts of the program.

How long will you study?

The ELSA program has 5 levels (Levels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5). You will receive a certain number of classes according to your level of English. Students do not all start and finish classes together. New students will enter and graduate at different times in the year. Your teacher will tell you your end date 5 weeks before you are due to finish the program.

Every few months, you will take some short ELSA program tests. These tests tell you and the teacher how much you are improving, and if you are ready to move to the next level. The results are not shared with the class, and the tests are nothing to be nervous about! At the end of level 5 you take an Exit test. This shows your Canada Language Benchmarks.

Volunteers

Teachers sometimes have volunteers from the community to help in the classes, and provide more listening and speaking practice.

Student Teachers

Our instructors work with a number of colleges to provide placements for teacher training. Sometimes there may be a student teacher in your class with your regular teacher.

STUDENTS' RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

You have the Right to:

- Receive fair treatment without discrimination
- Be treated with respect
- Feel safe
- Confidentiality
- Receive good, professional service
- Receive information about other services
- Decide which services you want or need

PARTICIPATION

ATTENDANCE:

- You must come to school every day. If you cannot come to school, phone the school **each day**. You can be absent if:
 1. You are sick (If you are sick for more than a week, you need to bring a doctor's note.)
 2. You have an **important** appointment.
 3. Your children are sick or have an important appointment. Please don't bring your children to class.
- Please make appointments to go to the doctor, dentist, driving test, etc. before or after your class, not during your class time.
- ELSA classes are valuable, free, and a privilege, so good attendance is very important. Poor attendance is bad for you and other students.
- If you miss more than 2-3 days of school per month and do not call, you will receive a warning and you may lose the privilege of attending class.

BREAKS:

There are 2 types of breaks from school that you can take:

(1) Leave of Absence:

You can take **2 weeks per year** for vacation, sickness or family problems. Your space is held for you, but you lose your hours of instruction. Tell the ELSA Administrator and your teacher before you take your break. You cannot leave for more than two weeks each year. You will need to complete a Leave of Absence form, which the ELSA Administrator will give you.

(2) Exit:

If you need to leave school for **more than 2 weeks**, you must stop school. You do not lose instruction hours, and can return to class after the Exit if there is space. If there is no space in the class at that time, you will be put at the bottom of the waitlist for that class. Please speak to your teacher and the ELSA Administrator if you want to exit. If you exit the ELSA program for longer than 6 months, you must go back to the Assessment Centre for re-assessment.

You can enter the ELSA Program 3 times in the Literacy - Level 3 program, and 2 times in the Level 4-5 program. That means you can take 2 exits in the Literacy to 3 and 1 exit in the level 4-5 program.

LATENESS:

Please do not be late for class. It interrupts the teacher and other students. If you are late every day, we will ask you to stop school. Please talk to your teacher if you can not come to school on time.

PARTICIPATING IN CLASS:

When you come to class, we expect you to treat the teacher and students with respect. You need to practice using your English with other students. Sometimes the teacher will ask you to work in pair and group activities. This is an important part of the program.

FINISHING CLASSES:

You finish the ELSA program when

- a. your English level is above level 6, or
- b. you use up all your ELSA hours

NEW ADDRESS / PHONE NUMBER:

Please tell us if you move or get a new phone number. Please tell the teacher and office staff **as soon as you know** that you are moving to a different school or leaving for any reason. Teachers like to know who is in the class and they also like to say goodbye!

ENGLISH ONLY:

- Please speak English at the Language Centre.
- Please speak only English in the classroom.
- We strongly encourage you to speak only English all the time you are here, including before and after class and during the breaks.
- You will learn faster if you speak English as much as possible. Your teacher is there to help you when you do not understand. You will not need to translate into your language.
- It is difficult for the teacher to teach if people are speaking different languages.
- It is very important to respect other students in the class who do not understand your language. Some students may feel isolated (lonely) if others are speaking in a language they can't understand.

TELEPHONES:

- Please turn OFF your cell phone during class, or put it on "Silent /Vibrate".
- Please do not speak on your cell phones inside the Language Centre
- Please do not give out the Language Centre phone number. It is for emergency messages only (e.g. child's school). The Office staff will not take personal messages (e.g. appointments).
- Please limit your calls to 3 minutes when you use the office phone.

NOISE:

There are other offices on our floor. Please do not go into the hallway to talk with your classmates or on your cell phone during break. Stay in the school or go outside the building so that you do not disturb those offices. Please do not run or make a lot of noise when going to the elevator.

OUR FACILITY

ACCESS:

- The office is open every day from 8:30 am – 4:00 pm.
- The office is open from 5:30-9:00 pm on Mon./ Wed./ Thurs. for evening classes.

CHILDREN:

Children may **not** be brought to class. We do not have facilities for children.

COFFEE BREAKS:

- We do not have facilities for making coffee for students.
- There is a water fountain. Please bring your own small bottle to use - we do not provide paper cups.
- Please do not leave food or drinks in the classrooms. Please clean up any spills of food or drink, and report this to your teacher so it can be properly cleaned.

WASHROOMS:

The men's and women's washrooms are near the elevator. Please ask your teacher for the door code.

- PLEASE put only toilet paper down the toilet. Put garbage in the bins. Keep them tidy.
- If there is no toilet paper or there is some other problem with the washroom, please tell someone in the office.

FIRST AID:

There is a first aid kit in the Teachers' Staff Room. Please ask any teacher / staff for help.

PARKING:

Parking is available on the streets around the school. The Administrator at the front desk can explain where to park.

- Please do not use the parking lot under the building or parking spaces belonging to other workers in the building.
- Do not park in the back lane. Your car will be towed away.
- Please read the parking signs on the street very carefully. The City of North Vancouver is very strict about parking and gives parking tickets to people who park too long in a space.

FIRE AND EMERGENCY:

Instructions on what to do in an emergency are posted in every classroom. Every few months we have an emergency drill so that everyone knows what to do if there is a fire or other emergency.

- Please **do not use the elevator** in an emergency.

For adult students of English, we can provide:

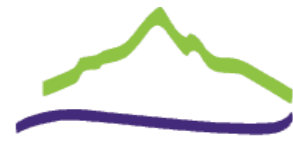
- All levels of the English Language Services for Adults (ELSA) program, free for those
